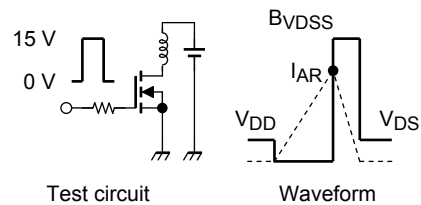
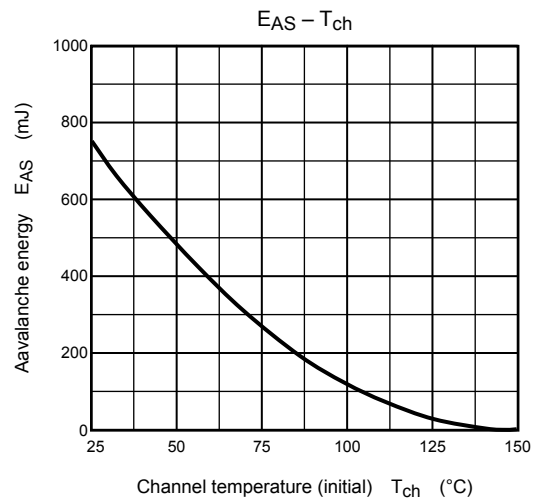
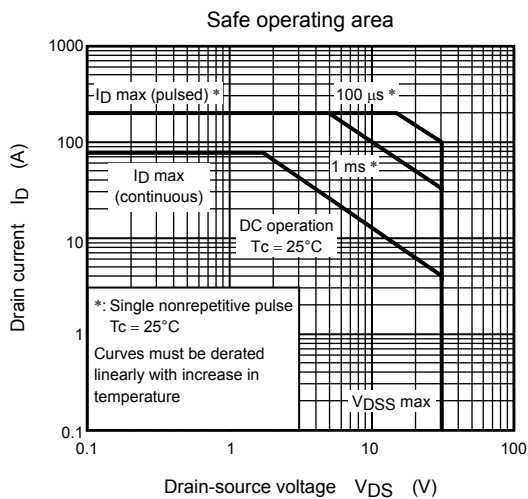
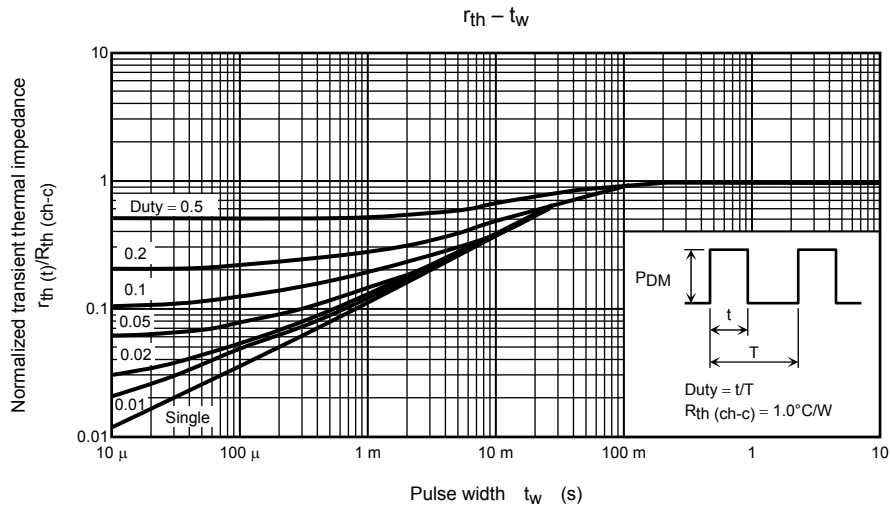
I_{DR2} , I_{DRP2} : Current flowing between the drain and the S1 pin. Ensure that the S2 pin is left open.
