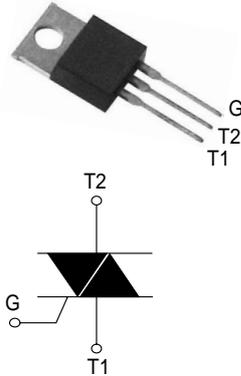
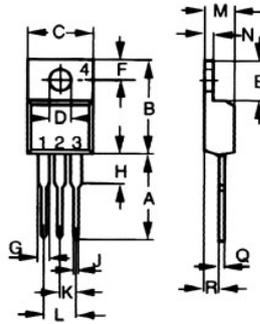

Fig. 1: Maximum power dissipation versus RMS on-state current (full cycle).

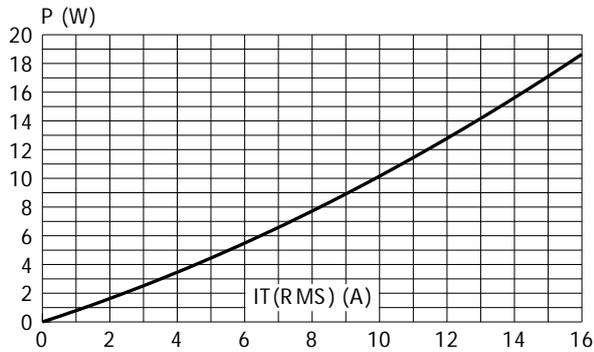


Fig. 3: Relative variation of thermal impedance versus pulse duration.

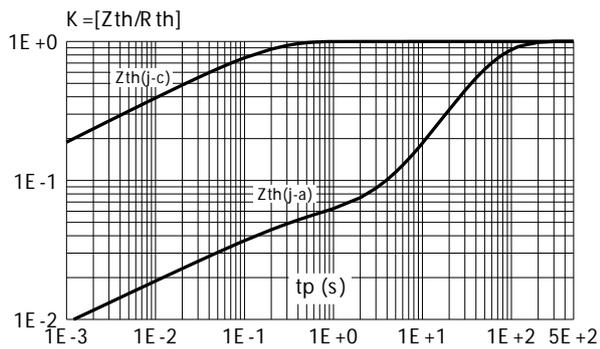


Fig. 5: Surge peak on-state current versus number of cycles.

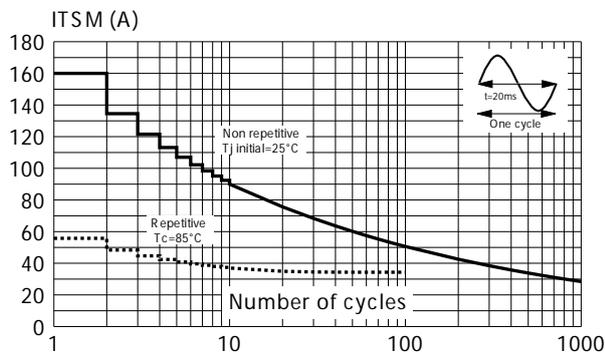


Fig. 2-1: RMS on-state current versus case temperature (full cycle).

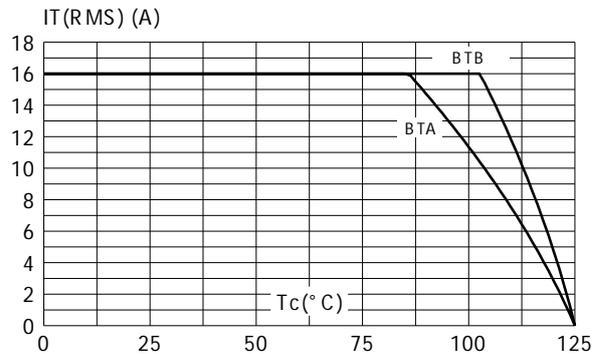
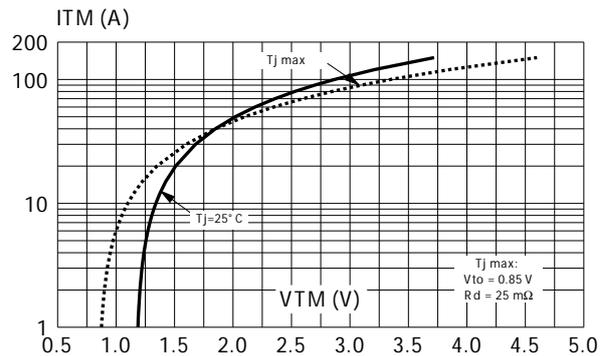


Fig. 4: On-state characteristics (maximum values)

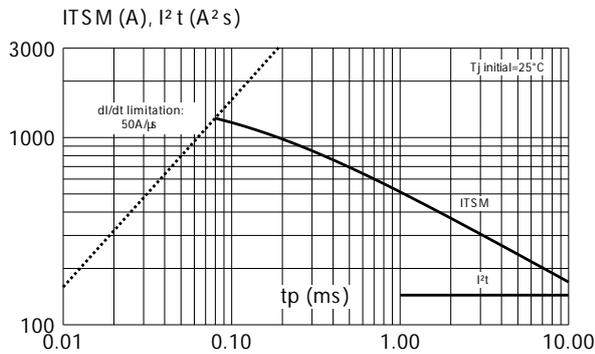


Fig. 8: Relative variation of critical rate of decrease of main current versus $(dV/dt)_c$ (typical values).

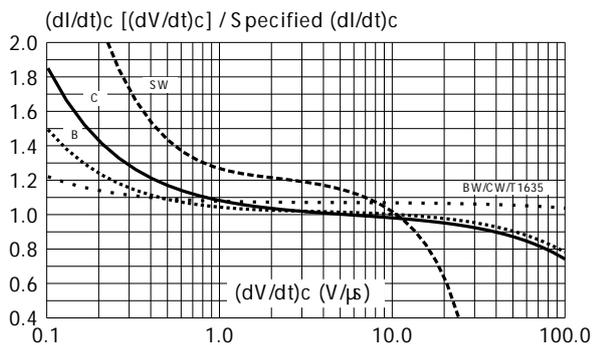


Fig. 7: Relative variation of gate trigger current, holding current and latching current versus junction temperature (typical values).

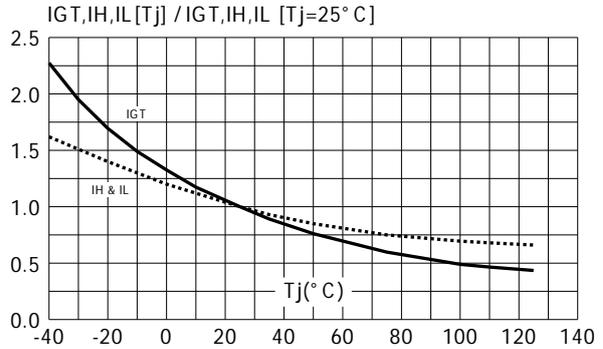


Fig. 9: Relative variation of critical rate of decrease of main current versus junction temperature.
