

The threshold voltage remains within acceptable operating limits over the full operating temperature and post radiation. Radiation Characteristics

IRHLYS77034CM, 2N7607T3

International Rectifier Radiation Hardened MOSFETs are tested to verify their radiation hardness capability. The hardness assurance program at International Rectifier is comprised of two radiation environments. Every manufacturing lot is tested for total ionizing dose (per notes 5 and 6) using the TO-3 package. Both pre- and post-irradiation performance are tested and specified using the same drive circuitry and test conditions in order to provide a direct comparison.




Fig a. Typical Single Event Effect, Safe Operating Area




Fig 1. Typical Output Characteristics




Fig 2. Typical Output Characteristics




Fig 3. Typical Transfer Characteristics




Fig 4. Normalized On-Resistance Vs. Temperature




Fig 5. Typical On-Resistance Vs Gate Voltage




Fig 6. Typical On-Resistance Vs Drain Current




Fig 7. Typical Drain-to-Source Breakdown Voltage Vs Temperature




Fig 8. Typical Threshold Voltage Vs Temperature




Fig 9. Typical Capacitance Vs. Drain-to-Source Voltage




Fig 10. Typical Gate Charge Vs. Gate-to-Source Voltage




Fig 11. Typical Source-Drain Diode Forward Voltage




Fig 12. Maximum Drain Current Vs. Case Temperature




Fig 13. Maximum Safe Operating Area




Fig 14. Maximum Avalanche Energy Vs. Drain Current




Fig 15. Maximum Effective Transient Thermal Impedance, Junction-to-Case




Fig 16a. Unclamped Inductive Test Circuit




Fig 16b. Unclamped Inductive Waveforms




Fig 17a. Basic Gate Charge Waveform




Fig 17b. Gate Charge Test Circuit




Fig 18a. Switching Time Test Circuit




Fig 18b. Switching Time Waveforms


