

## Silicon Carbide Power Schottky Diode


### Features

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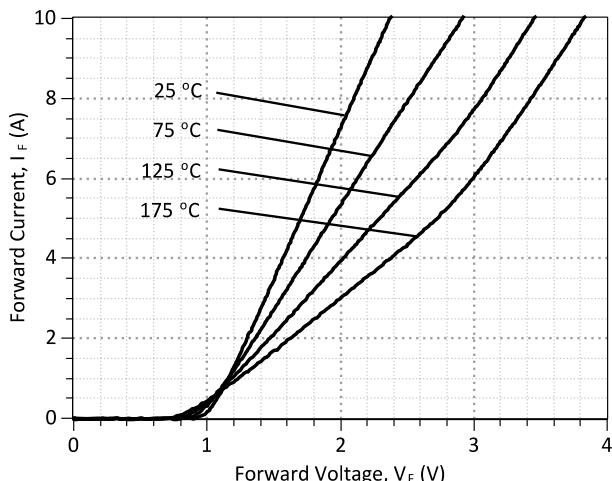


Figure 1: Typical Forward Characteristics




Figure 2: Typical Reverse Characteristics

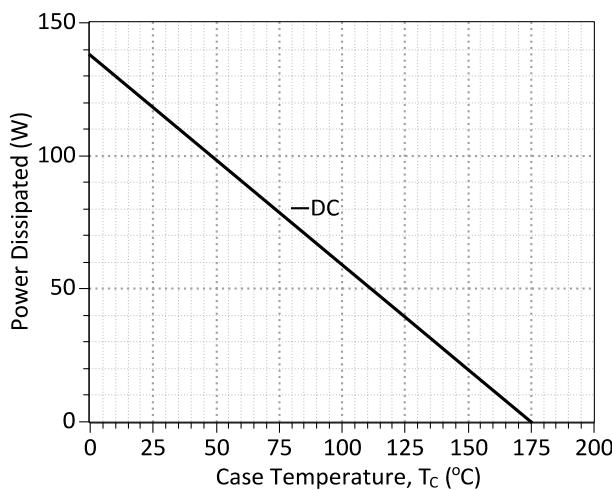


Figure 3: Power Derating Curve




Figure 4: Current Derating Curves ( $D = t_p/T$ ,  $t_p = 400 \mu s$ )  
 (Considering worst case  $Z_{th}$  conditions )

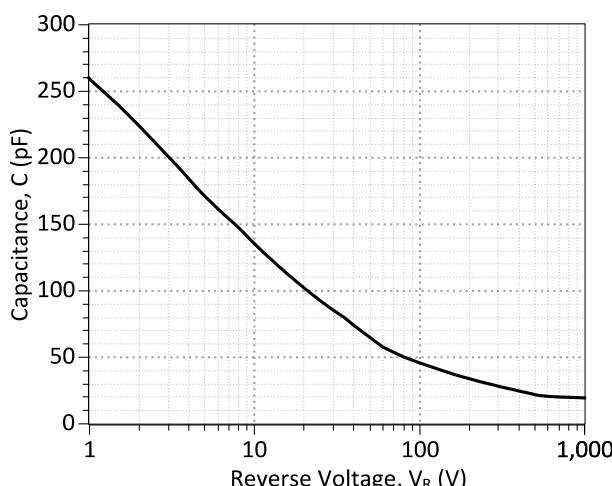


Figure 5: Typical Junction Capacitance vs Reverse Voltage Characteristics




Figure 6: Typical Switching Energy vs Reverse Voltage Characteristics




Figure 7: Current vs Pulse Duration Curves at  $T_c = 155 \text{ } ^\circ\text{C}$






Figure 8: Transient Thermal Impedance
